

But rather than just plonking a heap of finished kits on the display table I thought it would be a good idea to have a theme or series of themes for displaying our finished models to the public.



So to get the ball rolling what I would like from you is a list of completed models/dioramas that you would be willing to display, this should help with organizing themes.



SEARCH FOR A MANCAVE



In a land far far away, many years ago – well Belverdere, Kent England, 1952 my man cave was my bedroom – with small area with a tray. This was okay, until 1960, when motorcycles and girls came along – modelling was temporarily suspended.

In 1962 emigrated to NZ with my parents, new life, new job spray painting and vacuum coating – making things look like chrome plating. I even did some models and parts in chrome finish – looked good.

This was also the era of slot cars, so my man cave became a small shed behind the house where I built race cars, some of which I sold to Queen St Club Pit Stop – 1/24th scale. I also painted car bodies for people which gave me half the price of a second hand Escort Van. My man cave from 1979-1984 was a large corner of my flat. During this period I was a member of IPMS Auckland branch – good fun.

1985 my partner and I decided to travel so we flew to the UK. I bought a converted camper van/motorhome, an old Sunblest Bread Van, and went around Europe for six months – great adventures but no room for a 'mancave'. Back to the UK to find a job which ended up to be managing an estate for a millionaire, Michael Carlton who owned the Hunter One flying team – Hunter single seater and two seater trainers, 2 Jes Provosts and a Meteor night fighter, based at Biggin Hill in Kent. No modelling but spent a lot of time around aircraft.

In 1987, a new job in Bermuda (9 years) no time or room for a man cave or modelling. Then back to the UK for another 11 years where I was a chauffeur for the CEO of a building company driving all over the UK. We bought a flat but no room for a man cave – although I did have a bit of a hide-away in the loft but no the time, often working six days a week. We had all our furniture and possessions shipped to England, including some 300 hundred models, unmade.

In 2007 my wife and I decided to come back to NZ to retire and shipped back our effects, which included a lot of my models. We bought a lifestyle block, 15km up in the hills behind Warkworth with a nice brick house, and more importantly a double garage – half of which is my man cave. First few years we were busy with the property but now I have some 'time-out' so finally back to modelling which is great!

GLORY DAY ARDMORE

Last Sunday was a glorious summer's day heightened by the wonderful display of aircraft at Ardmore aerodrome. Star of the display was the newly restored De Havilland Mosquito which flew on 3 separate occasions thrilling the large crowd. A display of model De Havilland Mosquito's was in the Warbirds hangar with a beautiful 1/24 Airfix Mosquito built by John Darlington the centre piece.

The team curating the Warbirds Model Display and library put on a Pearl

Harbour themed display of models, which included some reference material to put everything in context, including maps and a poster from the movie Tora Tora Tora.

The display of model aircraft at the Warbirds Hangar is without doubt the largest display of aircraft models in the country. It is wonderfully presented with interesting memorabellia and handy information boards. The models on display coverage a broad range of types and eras and are all made to very high standards. Seeing a collection like this is very inspirational and is a great tribute to the aviation industry. The team curating the display are to be hugely congratulated for their wonderful efforts with this display and I encourage all club members to go and have a look sometime. IPMS Auckland club members Henry Ludlam and Dave Stewart are on the team at Warbirds and can no doubt advise when the collection is available for viewing and what is involved if you have models to donate to the collection.



BUFFALO STANCE Tamiya 1/48 Brewster B339 Buffalo "Pacific Theatre" By Peter Harrison

This was my out of the box build for our recent club RNZAF theme night. It represents an aircraft from No.488 Squadron based in Singapore during 1941. There is a book about the squadron entitled "Last Stand in Singapore" by Graham Clayton. I heard an interview with the author on the radio which influenced my choice of subject. The kit is trouble-free and fun to build and is a lesser known subject outside of aviation enthusiast circles. Recommended.

DEVEL DEMON Grand Phoenix 1/48 McDonnell F3H Demon By Rob Willis

This is the 1/48th Grand Phoenix McDonnell F3H Demon. Released back in 2004 and now out of production (although AZ Models release it under their own label and HobbyBoss have done one in injected plastic...) Kit is a mix of plastic, resin and etch. Goes together well with slightly fiddly assembly around the nose/intakes/ front wheel well area. Built OOB and using the kit decals (which were superb). Only fault was a lack of weapons pylons in the kit - which leaves it looking a bit bare... It's a big aircraft - comparable in size to a Phantom - and certainly looks impressive on the shelf.
