



Polar Lights IKS AMAR – Klingon K'T'Inga Class Battle Cruiser 1/350 scale.


1/350 scale model of the Klingon Vessel(s) from the First Battle Sequence of Star Trek The Motion Picture (1979) where 3 Klingon ships encounter V'ger enroute to earth.

Kit Number 0950, Price \$280.00 from Modelair. (Expensive, yes... Thank Licensing)

Number of parts 133. (Including 1 resin part- the top of the dome above the bridge – almost at the centre of the image AND a sturdy metal stand and hemispherical case for it.) There are 6 Black sprues – 3 are large single pieces – the Upper and Lower Main Hull, and the Hemispherical stand (106 parts) and 1 Clear sprue (27 parts)

Model Dimensions Length:60.96 cm (24 in) Width (max): 43.815 cm (17.25 in)

This is a rather large and impressive kit of the First Film Iteration of the classic Series D-7 Klingon Cruiser in it's larger, better armed and more "up-to-date" version, the K't'Inga class. Clocking in with 133 parts it has more than tripled the parts count of the AMT kit of old, and the better design means that the old AMT problem of a very fragile neck joint behind that forwards bulb head is largely a thing of the past. (Ask me how I know!!)



A great deal of trouble and thought has been taken in the design at every stage. For example – there is a Polar Lights LED lighting kit available for it, and the instructions in the kit SPECIFI-CALLY make calls to the Lighting kit instructions at EVERY stage, and advise a lot of pre paining and preparation and when to clip parts together without cement, and when gluing is necessary. (A Plus for the lighting kit is that no soldering is required – Connectors etc are all included, as are tinted transparencies for the windows & engine lights etc.(And, yes, I will be getting a set, even at 60 odd US\$.)



More good forethought: The Kit is molded in opaque Black plastic, the better for internal lights (No glow or bleed!) and the assembly sequences mean that a lot of pre-painting can be done without risk of damaging it when eliminating joins and the like. There is also a Aztec full masking set available as well as 2 Aftermarket Paragraphix PE sets for this, an external detail set and a full Shuttle Bay for the rear upper hull housing – as shown below... (Those are all also 'under consideration', currently.)



A largish decal sheet provides marking for the IKS AMAR the lead ship of the 3 in the scene, and Full colour Painting Instructions are found on the side panels of the lower box half. Along with a full paint list referencing Testors Enamels and Tamiya Acrylic colours. By the way all photos were found online and are of a fully functional, lighting fitted, kit. Black plastic generally does not photograph well so there are very few images of the Sprue Trees online.

According to a number of reviews the parts generally fit very well, but a number of joins will need attention and filler, and the fit of some parts can be markedly improved with some judicious sanding. All comment on the NECESSITY of reading and understanding the instructions, ESPECIALLY when fitting the lighting kit. (One stage has you use the lower side of the bridge upper deck as a JIG to assemble the bulbous lower half of the nose uppers, but NOT to cement them together with the jig piece until AFTER fitting the lights. I would probably use blutack to set the angles right.)

All in all the kit looks to be a very nice rendition of the K'T'Inga class Battle Cruiser, and certainly a vast improvement on the old AMT 1/650 version with its attendant issues. The decals provided are far more complete that the simple Klingon symbols from that kit and the detail sets, masks and lighting kit should give the modeler many hours of "fun"! (Even before they begin 'weathering' it!

Lanmo Model Sherman M1A1 Type Dozer Kit By Lance Whitford



Lanmo Model are a fairly new producer from China who have a growing range of 1/35 conversion kits that cover an increasing variety of subjects, both Allied and Axis. This one caught my eye as there are no good representations of the Dozer attachment for Sherman's equipped with the VVS suspension. This came as a field conversion kit which could be fitted to all models of Sherman. When the later HVSS suspension appeared a modified version was produced to fit the wider track of these late models. Lanmo also produce a similar conversion for those. The set cost me \$52 plus GST from a seller on Ali Express and because I bought a set of 3D printed tracks with the conversion set I qualified for free postage.

The kit is produced in a multi-media format which includes three pieces of resin which make up the blade and the bulk of the arms, two photoetched frets, a frame carrying a bunch of 3D printed parts and last but not least a small piece of pre-cut brass tube. The parts look well produced and appear to be comprehensively detailed. All these come packaged in a sturdy cardboard box. My set came minus the instructions and I contacted Lanmo via their Facebook page and they provided an electronic copy. These are very well produced and I have included them to show how detailed this set is.

I look forward to finding a suitable subject to fit this dozer blade to.

- 本产品由光敏树脂制成,产品会随着光照时间的增多而变得 越来越硬。所以在制作前一定要减少产品被光线照射的时间, 以免产生硬化不容易剪切。
- 2.在产品开封后的喷一层水补土能有效防止产品被光线照射, 所以如果有条件的话,请为产品喷一层水补土后再开始制作。 3.制作时可用锋利的剪钳和刀片处理支撑。有些情况下需要先 用刀片连支撑一起将零件整体从底板切下,然后再用剪钳剪去 支撑。
- 4.未使用的零件请收入避光的盒内,并且注意加热后可以使零件软化和塑形。
- This product is made of photosensitive resin, and the product will become harder and harder as the light time increases. Therefore, it is necessary to reduce the time that the product is exposed to light before production, so as not to be too hard and not easy to cit.
- Spraying a layer of water and soil after the product is opened can effectively prevent the product from being exposed to light, so if possible, please spray a layer of water and soil on the product before starting production.

 3. The support can be handled with sharp scissors and blades during production. In some cases, it is necessary to cut the whole part from the base plate with the blade and the support first, and then use the scissors to cut the support.
- 4. Please store unused parts in a light-proof box, and pay attention to softening and deformation of parts after heating.










